Due to ongoing issues the current GMF Trail maps are out of date. It has been brought to the PRT's attention that something needs to be done with the current maps. The Chairman would like to reduce the distribution of the current maps to ensure hikers still can find their way, but concurrently establish a subcommittee to address the errors in the current maps, rectify the errors, update and/or confirm the other trails, print and distribute the new maps to the public.

Additionally this subcommittee should attempt to address trail map errors/disputes with social media apps such as AllTrails, Topo Maps, Hiking Project, etc. to ensure that as many trail resources are accurate to keep hikers safe, reduce flora/fauna disruption, maintain private property rights.

A Hiker Code of Conduct is important to share on maps and local signage to better educate and reinforce positive hiking etiquette to ensure a positive experience for ALL hikers. ### Original version:

#### HIKER PARKING

Hiker parking is NOT permitted at the trailheads or on residential streets. Streets and trailheads are patrolled regularly by the Marshal and vehicles may be ticketed/towed.

Please park along Ute Pass Avenue, Lake Street and Olathe Street, then walk to the Trailheads. When walking on the roads, please be mindful of vehicles by walking **against** traffic in a single file.

### TRAIL USE RULES

This place is here for you to enjoy because the people before you took care of it. Please do the same.

Hike at your own risk.

Trails are designed for HIKING only, no bikes, horses or motorized use allowed. NO FIRES, camping, smoking or shooting.

Pack out trash and litter. Leave no trace.

Carry water. NO potable water on trails.

DOGS must be kept on leash. Please clean up after your pet. Stay on trail. Do not cut switchbacks.

#### HIKER PARKING
