1. CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL

Parks, Recreation, and Trails meeting called to order at 4:01pm by Chair Stroope.

2. ADDITIONS, DELETIONS, OR CORRECTION TO THE AGENDA

Dixon moved to approve the agenda. Walker seconded. Motion passed - 3/0.

3. SPEAKERS NOT ON THE AGENDA

No public comments.

4. CONSENT AGENDA

Dixon moved to approve the meeting minutes from July 26, 2023. Stroope seconded. Motion passed - 4/0.

Action items reviewed:

Dixon has submitted advice memos to town staff regarding downed tree on Conn Trail and concerns about the high flow of water on Catamount Creek. Walker will check with public works about the tree on Conn Trail.

A list of concerns on the stilling basin from McIntire and Walker are still needed for an advice memo to town staff and Planning Commission.

An advice memo regarding playground equipment still needs to be written to town staff. The smaller piece of equipment does not need the orange mesh since the other side had been designed to be open. The larger piece of equipment needs a panel which has been ordered. The order needs to be checked on.

Kita: inventory the memorial benches to assess their conditions.

5. BUSINESS

- a. Committee discussed the draft stilling basin landscaping plan. The following was agreed on: take off the two extra paths from Ute Pass Ave, add a pathway from Stop sign to the social trail, have the Stop sign area be drought tolerant and low growing plants so they do not obstruct drivers line of sight. Chair Stroope will ask Carla Chapman to incorporate these changes before the public meeting on August 16th. Chapman has donated her time to make these plans. How to water the area? Possibly water from a private residence.
 Kita will check on the viability of the water hydrant on the stilling basin site. Is there landscaping around the boulders? Could the boulders be dropped to lower their profile?
 Dixon and Chair Stroope will work on the power point for the public meeting. Chair Stroope will present the revised plan by dividing it into quadrants for discussion. It was agreed by the committee that 2-3 public meetings on the stilling basin should be sufficient.
- b. Chair Stroope and Walker will meet to discuss the RFP for the Gazebo bridge grant on Friday, August 11, at 9:00am at the Greenbox offices.
- c. Creek Week 2023 will be October 7th. Kita moved to recommend to the Board the Creek Week proclamation and that the town will be participating on Saturday, October 7th. Dixon seconded. Motion passed 4/0. **Dixon will write an advice memo for the September Board meeting.**
- d. Chair Stroope reiterated about the HGMFF gift to the town for the 250th birthday of America and the 150th anniversary of Colorado. They are wanting to reinvision pool park with PRT's assistance. This could include year round public restrooms and a welcome center. PRT will pull ideas together and engage the community with public meetings. The funding could also be used for matching funds for other grants. Dixon asked about the timeline. The following was planned:

Present-January 2024: PRT has 3 precept workshops to define scope.

February-August 2024: Engage community. Meet with other town committees.

September 2024-August 2025: Engineering design. Order equipment.

September 2025: Break ground.

May 2026: Ribbon cutting.

Chair Stroope will present a PRT committee report regarding this project at the next Board meeting.

Conn Trail easement should be a project that PRT continues to work on as the Pool Park project is being done.

6. CORRESPONDENCE

An email from Deacon Patrick was about concern on the Thomas Trail crossing the falls and a flooded piece of trail at the beginning of the Garden of Eden. CSU has been unresponsive to requests about reducing water flow from the reservoirs. Kita suggested more high water signs at Thomas. **Dixon will provide to Kita**. Friends have been mitigating the clogging of the creek to reduce the flooded trail.

Chair Stroope received a phone call from the El Paso County deputy about a woman who has 2 dogs that was threatened by a man on the Wallace Reserve. The man has a large dog that was unleashed and the woman sprayed his dog with bear spray. He then threatened to spray her with bear spray. Wallace Reserve is located in unincorporated El Paso county but the trails are on the GMF town trail maps. Chair Stroope will post more signs and make a presence when the man regularly hikes. **Dixon will provide Chair Stroope with Bark Ambassador posters.**

7. REPORTS

Walker reported that the pool had 90+ people at the pool, there has been adequate staffing and more donations made. Pool is still operational with the help of bandaids. Suggests that volunteers be trained next year. Chair Stroope asked that Walker write a draft pool budget for 2024. Mayor Dixon had obtained a lifeguard schedule that was helpful. Pool parking lot fence is finished. There is room for 3-5 parking spaces plus the handicap space inside the fence. PRT's budget includes \$2,000 to repaint the pool fence. Walker asked for input on having a planter in one of the corners of the fence. Kita will revise the pool parking site plan and send it to Chair Stroope. Chair Stroope would like to have the PRT sponsor an end of summer town celebration at the pool with a food truck and a suggestion to wear Hawaiian shirts. PRT set a date of September 9, 4-8pm.

Kita and Zeh mitigated musk thistle on HGMFF Joyland property but there is much more to mitigate.

9. ADJOURNMENT at 5:44pm.

Stilling Basin Landscaping Notes August 16, 2023 6:30-7:30pm

Ten GMF residents, four PRT committee members and the Town Manager attended the Stilling Basin (SB) landscaping public forum.

OVERVIEW

Hydrant at SB is not active. Previous irrigation was displaced by the SB project. Need to research how to irrigate new landscaping.

Crosswalk markings on Ute Pass Ave at the STOP sign will be replaced once the SB project is completed. The project is 95% complete: first hydro seeding by Hotel St and Ute Pass Ave did not take and needs to be reseeded. PRT is requesting that the contractor use the recommended native seed mix of clover and wildflowers.

Nothing permanent can be located in the area where the SB will be dredged. It can be seeded though.

Memorial benches will be relocated to Gazebo Park while SB landscaping is being done.

PROPOSED STOP SIGN AREA LANDSCAPING

Needs to be low growing for drivers/pedestrians safety/line of sight.

Transition across Ute Pass Ave needs to be distinguished.

Native plantings to complement the culture of GMF.

First phase: hardscaping and native grasses/wildflowers

PROPOSED HOTEL ST LANDSCAPING

Be conscious of the utilities and other obstructions in this area Wayfinding signs, memorials, benches, history of GMF Hotel Native grasses/wildflowers, bushes

PROPOSED RECESSED BENCH AREA

No planting by retaining wall (private property)

Need to know the property line/have meeting with property owner

Level the areas in between buttresses for benches

Leftover landscaping materials from the fishing pier project are available

PROPOSED BUSHES/TREES for LANDSCAPING

Canada Cherry tree does not do well at our altitude, existing ones are dead or dying

Recommended to use native, low water, sustainable plants Use CSU Extension as a resource

Native plants that do well: sage, lavender, salvia, Russian sage, mountain mahogany, chokecherry bushes, yucca, potentilla (yellow and white), yarrow

Plant bushes around top of SB to prevent exploration of the SB More ground cover vs bushes, better erosion control: kinnikinnick, spiderwort, sedum

MEMORIALS

GMF Hotel granite marker should be more visible. Possibly located on the sloped area on the walking path between the STOP sign and the Ute Pass Ave side of the social trail.

Could spots be sold for additional memorials in that area? Possible fundraising potential.




Friends of Ute Pass Trails Catamount Re-Route

Town of GMF Land

Workday 4, August 19, 2023: 22 Volunteers 118 volunteer hours Internal workday, August 23, 2023: 4 Volunteers 29 volunteer hours

- Finished re-route to avoid eroded trail section, dug in channels and water bars to protect new trail from erosion
- Removed noxious weeds from fragile Garden of Eden meadow
- Completed dredging the diversion canal to prevent the rising Catamount Creek from flooding the trail
- Lopped/pruned vegetation overgrowth
- Installed 50' split rail fence into solid bedrock to guide hikers onto the new re-route
- Installed signage to direct hikers








